WORKS ON PAPER

Works on Paper is the outcome of a suggestion given me by Mr. John Maynard in celebration of my appointment as Director of the Govett-Brewster Art Gallery. Mr. Maynard handled all the technical problems in New Zealand while I organised the exhibition from the United States.

Works on Paper consists of drawings, paintings and prints of various media and was chosen from fifteen artists working on the West Coast. The choices that were made were quite personal—however the exhibition does take on a certain flavour of West Coast movements and idealogies. For some time now California has been concerned with the figurative or image element in art and I have concentrated on this concern. A number of developments have taken place within this context and it is hoped the present exhibition will bring some of these to light.

There have been numerous developments which border on, if not embrace, surrealism. The work of Franklin Williams, Philip Linhares, Judy Linhares, William Geis and Harold Gregor come within this realm. The humorous element along with the strangeness P. Linhares and Gregor impart in their work, group them in the above camp. While it is the unique juxtaposition of elements both literary and visual that bring L. Linhares, Williams and Geis into that grouping.

Visionary and metaphysical imagery is another submovement within the general context of figurative. Numerous artists have been working within this boundary and I have included Philip Hocking, Myra Hocking, Ronald Dahl and Leroy Parker. These

artists have a preoccupation with metaphysics and fantasy and interpret their private world in very individual ways.

Arthur Okamura does not fall directly within the above mentioned catagories but possibly between them. His work is sometimes surreal and sometimes visionary. He floats in and out of these catagories with ease and sureness. Kenneth Price is another artist who is hard to categorise but falls within the broad concern of the figurative.

Still another development, which is the logical continuation of the original figurative movement, is the school of realism which has developed on the West Coast as well as nationally. Included within this realm are Robert Bechtle, Charles Gill, Max Hein and David Anderson. All but Anderson owe something to pop art as well. Bechle and Gill have worked closely together for some years and share a common studio. They both begin with photographs, the former drawing from projected slides while the other uses a photo-lithograph technique and prints the original image, changing colour and position only. Max Hein also uses photomethods, however more is done to adjust the composition. David Anderson's unpretentious drawings represent a continuation of the figurative.

There is a definite trend in the United States towards image oriented painting, possibly as a reaction to and dissatisfaction with abstract art. This show is a limited representation of this trend on the West Coast.


